First ALWA-User-Workshop

The Institute for Employment Research (IAB) is pleased to announce the First ALWA-User-Workshop, which will take place in Nuremberg (Germany), Weddigenstraße 20-22, from 06. to 07. December 2011. The workshop, organized by the IAB-Research Department "Education and Employment over the Life Course" and the IAB-Research Group "Occupational Labor Markets", will bring together data producers and users of the life course dataset "Working and Learning in a Changing World", in German "Arbeiten und Lernen im Wandel", ALWA. This dataset contains detailed information about the life histories of more than 10.400 adults in working age and allows longitudinal analysis in particular about schooling and training decisions, labor market behavior as well as about processes of family formation and regional mobility.
