Call for Papers

The Central European University Labor Project and the Upjohn Institute for Employment Research invite submissions of completed papers or extended abstracts for a workshop on wage determination using linked employer-employee data (LEED). The workshop is an activity of a new COST-sponsored network on comparative analysis of enterprise data. Papers on any topic of wage determination involving the use of LEED may be proposed. A non-exhaustive list of topics would include:

- ◆ Wages and firm characteristics : industry, ownership, contract, size, productivity, performance.
- ◆ Wage differentials across and within firms.
- ◆ Effects of firm characteristics on overall wage inequality.
- ◆ Differences in wage effects in firm- versus worker-level data.
- ◆ Wage policies of firms.

Extended abstracts should be 400-600 words, including a description of the data used in the analysis. Please send your paper/abstract and any questions to budworkshop@upjohn.org with "submission [your last name]" as the subject line.
