International Workshop

The Institute for Employment Research (IAB), the Friedrich-Alexander-University Erlangen-Nuremberg and the Kiel Institute for the World Economy (IfW), as part of the EES research network, are organizing a workshop on labor market institutions and the macroeconomy on June 17 and 18, 2011. Approximately 12 papers will be selected for presentation in a single-plenary format.

Topics

The workshop aims to bring together high-quality research that is at the intersection of labor economics and macroeconomics. We are interested in theoretical and empirical contributions on how institutions affect the aggregate labor market performance and shape the reaction of the labor market to macroeconomic shocks. We are also particularly interested in papers relating micro and macro evidence on labor market characteristics. Suitable topics include (but are not limited to):

- The effect of labor market institutions on wages and labor market dynamics
- Lessons of the great recession for designing labor market institutions
- Differences in labor market dynamics between the United States and Europe
